Dear Graduate Student Employee:

As you're aware, Massachusetts requires college students to have health insurance. In an effort to improve student health plan programs at state colleges and universities, agencies including the Massachusetts Health Connector and the Department of Education established a consolidated contract bid process which this year included UMass Amherst.

Aetna Student Health has been awarded the 2011 – 2012 school-sponsored plan. The Student Health Insurance Plan (SHIP) meets or exceeds state requirements and provides you and your dependents with important benefits, services and programs.

Students taking five or more credits in a degree-seeking program are automatically enrolled in the individual SHIP and charged on the semester's tuition bill. Those taking fewer than five credits, including continuation fee students, and those seeking family coverage, must come to University Health Services (UHS) to enroll. UHS will process your enrollment and forward charges to the Bursar's Office for inclusion on the tuition bill. This is an annual plan, billed per semester. Coverage begins Aug.1, 2011 and ends July 31, 2012. If you are not enrolled for the Spring 2012 semester, your coverage will end Jan. 21, 2012; coverage for new spring students will begin Jan. 22, 2012.

Following are plan changes I wanted you to be aware of when seeking care at UHS and in the community. After a \$250 deductible, services provided in the community with a referral to a preferred provider will be covered at 85%; non-preferred providers will be covered at 75%. Most routine medical services provided at UHS will be covered at 100%.
